10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
York Hospital Heritage Precinct, comprising the *Residency Museum* and *Old York Hospital*, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is representative of the growth and development of York from the mid to late nineteenth century and the provision of Government services to the people of York in that period;

the place is a landmark in York and contributes to the community's sense of place by providing a physical and historical link with the provision of government services and development of York;

the place contains *Residency Museum* which is a valuable part of the architectural building stock of the early convict period in Western Australia and is a fine example of Victorian Georgian style of architecture in Western Australia; and *Old York Hospital* which is a fine example of Federation Arts and Craft style and is closely associated with the growth of York at the time of the gold boom; and,

York Hospital Heritage Precinct is an important tourist area and is seen as an integral part of the promotion of York as a tourist destination.
