10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Saint George's Cathedral has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

it is a fine example of Victorian Academic Gothic architecture, designed by noted Australian architect Edmund Blacket;

occuping a strategic position at the corner of Saint Georges Terrace and Cathedral Avenue, the cathedral is a major element within the Central Government Precinct, and makes a major contribution to the streetscape of central Perth;

as the Cathedral of the See of the Anglican Archibishop of Perth, the place is held in high regard by the members of the Anglican Church and the general community; and,

the building is closely associated with the establishment and growth of the State through its role as the premier place of worship for the Crown.
