10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Garrick Theatre, a single-storey brick walled, corrugated iron roofed Colonial Georgian style building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

its association with the establishment of the convict depot in Guildford which introduced a major change in the way the affairs of the colony were conducted;

it demonstrates the transition from an impoverished economy to the more affluent period following the arrival of the convicts bringing an influx of capital and cheap labour;

its aesthetic characteristics imparted by the simplicity of the Colonial Georgian architecture and the pleasant texture and warmth of colouring of the mellow brickwork;

its contribution to the scale and quality of the streetscape of the Meadow Street precinct; and,

its association with Lieutenant Du Cane.
