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10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**  
*Orient Hotel*, a Federation Academic Classical style three-storey hotel building on a corner site, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
  - the place is important for its association with the booming economic activity brought about by the discovery of gold in Western Australia and as a representative example of Fremantle hotels built around the turn of the century;
  - the place is important for its contribution to the aesthetic impact of the streetscape of High Street, Fremantle;
  - the place has social value as a meeting place of long standing and as a residence of several prominent people; and,

the place is important for its associations with Architect Michael Cavanagh, with the Marmion family who were associated with the earlier hotels on the site, and with the Parry family.
