10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

One Mile Jetty and Tramway, a timber jetty and light railway, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

a place of this scale, demonstrating an integrated process developed to deal with extreme transport hardships, is rare in early ship to land transferral systems in Australia;

the place has visual landmark qualities highly valued by the people of Carnarvon and of the Gascoyne region of Western Australia;

the place has a strong commercial association and familiarity with the people of Carnarvon and the Gascoyne region;

the 1899-1900 construction is representative of the work of the well-known contractors, Atkins and Law;

the place contains major surviving evidence of turn of the century Public Works Department of Western Australia timber jetty design and construction techniques; and,

it is a valued recreational asset to the community.
