10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Liveringa Homestead Group, consisting of a Federation Bungalow stone and 'corrugated iron' roof homestead and associated buildings, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is associated with the beginnings of settlement in the Kimberley district in 1881;
 - the elevated position of the homestead gives it a landmark quality;
 - the buildings and associated outbuildings form a significant pastoral precinct;

the place is associated with the Kimberley Pastoral Company and its shareholders who formed extensive political, economic and social networks throughout Western Australia;

the place was the first polling station in the area for the Commonwealth elections in 1901, and,

the place contributes to the sense of place of the Kimberley community.
