10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Fmr No. 6 Electricity Substation, a single-storey red brick and fibro cement building with a corrugated fibro cement roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place has strong aesthetic value in its unusual forms and spaces that arise from its staged development;
 - the place has some value in the streetscape setting and as part of a collective whole comprising the Boans' warehouse, the substation and No. 83 Brown Street;

* Although often called 'No. 6 Electricity and Gas Substation', it was only an electricity substation, owned by the Electricity and Gas Department of the Perth City Council.

the place is a representation of the industrial nature of East Perth throughout its history, particularly as much of this industrial fabric has been removed; and,

the place has some social value in its association with the provision of electric power in Western Australia.
