10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Courthouse and Gaol (fmr) has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the buildings are fine examples of colonial architecture largely built by convict labour;
 - the place forms an important part of the streetscape of Meadow Street;
 - the place is aesthetically linked to a civic precinct which dates from the early colonial period;
 - the place is integral to an understanding of the early settlement and development of Guildford; and,
 - the buildings are closely associated with Richard Roach Jewell, the Colonial Clerk of Works.
