10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Windsor Hall has cultural significance for the following reasons:

the place is a rare example of a two-storey Federation Free Style suburban residence, exhibiting details characteristic of the public architecture of H. J. Prockter:

the place is an important part of the streetscape of Queens Crescent and Alvan Street, and a landmark in Mount Lawley;

the place is representative of the establishment of the social and visual character of Mount Lawley in the early 1900s; and,

the place has a close association with Richard Haynes, a prominent lawyer and politician in Western Australia at the end of the nineteenth century.
