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10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*Warders Terrace*, comprising four cottages, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

together with the rows of terrace housing in Henderson Street, it forms a strong visual and functional boundary between the city and the original Convict Establishment grant;

together with the public buildings nearby, it forms a precinct unified by historical development and similarities in architectural style and the use of material, textures and colours, within which it displays a pleasing variety of individual details;

as some of the State's longest surviving worker accommodation it demonstrates, both in the quality of the accommodation it provided and subsequent improvements to the fabric, the status of warders; and,

due to the intact and original nature of the fabric, the building has the potential to contribute to an understanding of the nineteenth century construction techniques in Fremantle.
