10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
State Hotel (fmr), a two storey brick and iron building, prominently located in Gwalia, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

it was the Western Australian Government's first venture into the construction and management of hotels, and as such the place demonstrates an important shift in government policy;

as the most imposing building in Gwalia, it establishes the visual identity of the town;

the place is an important component of what has been described as a nationally significant townsite; and,

it is a fine example of the Federation Filigree style.
