10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Old York Fire Station, a Federation Free style brick and iron building, originally built as Council Chambers, and now a community centre, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place has high aesthetic value as a good example of Federation Free style architecture;
 - the place has close associations with the early York Municipal Council; and,
 - the place served for 75 years since 1914 as the community's fire station.

The toilet block, pottery studio, sheds, pergola, barbecue, swings and climbing structure at the rear of *Old York Fire Station* have little cultural heritage significance:
