A terrace of seven single storey houses constructed in 1886 as 'gentlemen's residences', with stone walls quoined in brick, corrugated galvanised iron roof with prominent chimneys, and bullnosed verandahs decorated with cast iron lace work.

7. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE OF PLACE (ASSESSMENT IN DETAIL)**

The place has been assessed by the National Trust of Australia (WA) and has been entered in the Register held by that body as a classified building with the following statement of significance:

The terrace is an important and now rare example of Victorian terrace housing, successfully recycled to modern living standards, but retaining the original Victorian architectural character. The terrace, stepping down the street, has environmental significance in a quiet residential manner.

The place has also been assessed by the Australian Heritage Commission and has been entered in the Register of the National Estate with the following statement of significance:

The place is located within the west end heritage precinct of Fremantle as defined in the Register of the National Estate.

The terrace is a highly visible element of the northern precinct of Fremantle prison and is among the first private residences observed by tourists on local tours.
