10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
House, 57 Dampier Terrace, a single-storey timber framed and iron clad building, constructed some time between c. 1900-1940, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is an excellent example of a building which displays the distinct aesthetic qualities of the vernacular architecture of the Broome township, which includes corrugated iron cladding, pitched roofs and trellis work;

the place was constructed as a result of the ongoing development of Broome as the centre of the pearling industry in Western Australia and was specifically associated with the provision of general merchandise in Broome in the 1940s, and with the operation of the pearling industry after World War Two; and,

the place contributes to the local community's sense of place, as a reminder of the town's culturally diverse social history and associations with the pearling and retail industries.
