10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

All Saints Anglican Church, Trayning, a single-storey masonry, asbestos cement and corrugated iron Church showing influences of the Federation Carpenter Gothic style, lych gate, bell tower, internal fixture and fittings and archaeological sites has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a fine representative example of the work of architects Eales & Cohen, and a good representative example of a small rural Church with influences of the Federation Carpenter Gothic style;

the place is associated with the State Government's push to develop the eastern district as an agricultural region in the 1920s; and,
the place continues to have cultural, spiritual and social associations for the local Anglican community and, more recently, for the local Uniting Church community.
