10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE.

Blackwood Inn has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place demonstrates the role of coaching inns as a part of the mid 19th century colonial transport network;

the place is a reminder of early European settlement of the region, the building contributes to the community's sense of history and place; and,

the place is a rare example of a staging inn which is still largely in its original form and continuing to serve its original function.

Buildings not included in this entry are the two outbuildings at the rear of the Inn, functioning as a laundry and new accommodation wing (built 1992).
