10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE  
*St Luke's (Anglican) Rectory*, a single-storey house with a corrugated iron roof and stone walls, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons;

the place is important in relation to the development of the Church of England Parish in Gingin;

the place is important for its aesthetic characteristics imparted by the texture of the materials and the built form of the steeply pitched iron roof together with the soft white stone walls set in the open woodland of native trees on the fringe of the townsite; and,

as part of the functioning of the Church of England Parish in Gingin in the latter part of the nineteenth century, the Rectory, together with St Lukes Church, contributes to the sense of place of the Church of England community.
