10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
His Majesty's Hotel, a two-storey Federation Free Classical rendered brick hotel building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is significant for the aesthetic qualities of the street elevations with their rhythm of ground floor arches at the curve in the facade and first floor fenestration under the parapet;
 - the place has landmark qualities, being the visual closure at the east end of the triangular space formed by the widening of Phillimore Street as it approaches Mouat Street;

the place is a very important element in the Fremantle West End, a nationally significant nineteenth century precinct, and has particular associations with the Philimore Street nineteenth century commercial area;

the place has a particularly long association with the Manning family, owners of the site from at least 1880 until 1990; and,

the place is representative of turn-of-the-twentieth century hotels in Fremantle.
