10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Commonwealth Bank, a two-storey, Inter War Stripped Classical style, commercial building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place has a strongly modelled facade and an overwhelming vertical scale which ensures an imposing presence in the streetscape;

the place is significant for its association with the Commonwealth Government's programme to create employment during the depression years of the 1930s;

the place is a fine example of a transitional style of architecture applied to a rural branch of the Commonwealth Bank; and,

representative of the sturdy architectural style adopted by the Commonwealth Bank to symbolise the stability of the institution.

The garage contributes little to the significance of the place.
