10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Residency Museum, a single-storey brick and iron structure, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is integral to the early settlement and development of York, and has a long term association with the adjacent *Old York Hospital*;
 - the place forms the last remaining components of what was the convict depot, a precinct of Government buildings that played an integral role in the development of York;
 - the place is a valuable part of the architectural building stock of the early convict period in Western Australia;
 - the place demonstrates the 1970s adaptation and reuse of a building for the first regional museum established under the *Museum Act 1969-73*; and,

the place is a fine example of Victorian Georgian style of architecture in Western Australia.
