10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Pinjarra Post Office has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is a fine example of public architecture of George Temple-Poole, one of Perth's prominent architects of the late nineteenth century;
 - the place is a fine example of a domestically scaled two-storey Federation Arts and Crafts public building;
 - the place is a demonstration of the development of postal services in the Murray District; from rented rooms to a prominent building located on a principal transport route;
 - the attached residence is a demonstration of a particular way of life in society at the time; and,

the place is aesthetically linked with other prominent public buildings in the town within a heritage precinct.
