STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE 10.

Toodyay Post Office and Residence has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the building represents the development of postal services to the district during a time of expansion of rural centres;

the building is a fine example of both turn-of-the-century Public Works architecture and civic architecture of George Temple Poole;

the building is an important part of the streetscape of Toodyay; and,

it is an important part of the townscape as the location for public and business activities within the community.
