10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
Toodyay Post Office and Residence has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the building represents the development of postal services to the district during a time of expansion of rural centres;
 - the building is a fine example of both turn-of-the-century Public Works architecture and civic architecture of George Temple Poole;
 - the building is an important part of the streetscape of Toodyay; and,
 - it is an important part of the townscape as the location for public and business activities within the community.
