10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Albany Town Hall, a stucco and granite, two storied public building with a clocktower, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is highly valued by the local community for its long and continued role as the principal public building associated with cultural and administrative activities in the town;
 - the place has historic value as the first major building project undertaken by the Albany Municipal Council;
 - the place reflects a period of growth and development in the town's history;
 - the place has been closely associated with key figures involved in local municipal activities;

the place has aesthetic value as a good example of a Victorian Free Classical building; and,

the place has landmark qualities with the clocktower being highly visible along York Street.
