10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Narembeen Museum, a single-storey timber framed weatherboard and galvanised corrugated iron building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place was the first church built and consecrated in Narembeen, the only church there for a period of twenty five years, and remains the only church building of its type in the district;

the place is a landmark feature of the Narembeen townsite;

the place is representative of a type of weatherboard church building, characteristic of many country towns, which is no longer common in the Western Australian wheatbelt; and,

the place demonstrates the activities and development of the Anglican congregation in Narembeen and the interaction of the interdenominational churches during their developing periods, representing a way of life that is no longer practised.

The former rectory has not been included in this assessment.
