10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*National Bank, Wagin* a double-storey rendered brick and corrugated iron building in the Federation Free Classical style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a well-executed, restrained, example of the Federation Free Classical style, clearly showing the influence of the National Bank's house style during the pre-World War I period which displays a fine, intact and authentic interior;

the classical symmetrical façade contributes to Wagin's significant commercial streetscape;

the place is associated with the well-known West Australian architectural firms of Hobbs, Smith & Forbes and Porter & Thomas.

The garage is of little significance, and the patio and steel clad shed are of no significance.
