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## 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

West Leederville Railway Footbridge, a painted timber structure with concrete footings and iron fixings, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the structure is the last remaining of the timber footbridges constructed on the Eastern Railway Line around the turn of the century and is the only Queen Post footbridge surviving in Western Australia:

the structure links Subiaco and West Leederville over a railway line that physically divides them. It is important for its contribution to the sense of place of both communities; the structure has provided access from West Leederville railway station to the Subiaco Oval for football games since the opening of Subiaco Oval in 1909.
