10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Telyarup Homestead, a Federation Queen Anne Style single-storey brick and iron farmhouse and associated farm structures, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place has an imposing form which is a prominent element in the landscape and clearly visible from the road;

the place is a fine example of the Federation Queen Anne style of architecture in a remote, rural location of southern Western Australia and displays quality craftsmanship;

the place has been a landmark since 1911 and contributes to the Gnowangerup and district community's sense of place; and,

the place is associated with its original owner, Michael Corbett, and the lifestyle of a successful sheep breeder, and with local pastoral families, in particular the House family.
