10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE  
*Narrogin Railway Station*, a brick walled and iron roofed building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 

the place illustrates the importance of rail transportation in the development of the agricultural districts of Western Australia, and the importance of Narrogin, in particular, as the primary transport interchange for the Upper Great Southern Railway system.

the place demonstrates the principal characteristics of a railway station of the 1920s in Western Australia;

the place has social importance as the former gateway to Narrogin.

The 1965 footbridge, and the fibro structure of the south of the original buildings, are not covered by this assessment as they are considered to be of low significance at this time.
