10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Gogo Homestead and Cave School, consisting of an Inter-War Bungalow style house of concrete block wall and 'corrugated iron' roof construction, various outbuildings, and a network of excavations, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

- the place is located on an early Kimberley lease, taken up in 1883;
- the place is associated with the Emanuel family who also held leases for Christmas Creek, Cherrabun, and Meda; and

the Gogo Cave School contributed to the educational needs of the community and was reputedly the first school to be established on a cattle station in Western Australia.

There are six other buildings to the east of the house, now mostly in ruins and of little heritage significance.
