10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
Chiverton House Complex has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is a prominent landmark in Northampton;
 - the place contributes an important element to the streetscape of Northampton;
 - the place is important for its close association with Captain Samuel Mitchell, a man who contributed significantly to the development of the mining industry and the Northampton District in the late nineteenth century; and,
 - the place is distinctive in representing a northern rural homestead development of the second half of the nineteenth century.
