10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
Saint Lawrence's Anglican Church, a brick and terra cotta tile building, in the Post War Ecclesiastical style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the building is an innovative example of post World War Two church design in Western Australia, reflecting the Modernist influence of post-war immigrant architects;
 - the building melds into its setting and displays all of the elements necessary, both internally and externally, to qualify as a fine piece of architectural composition. It has a high level of integrity and it is in sustainable condition;

the building is a clear enunciation of the designer's philosophical objectives for the building to be a neutral backdrop to ensure the congregation focused on the colour and movement of the liturgical presentation. The design demonstrates innovative solutions to problems such as sun control, lines of vision and the relationship between the celebrant and the congregation; and

the place is highly valued by the Dalkeith Parish in reflecting the needs of a new liturgical approach to church design following World War Two.
