10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
St. Werburghs Chapel and Cemetery has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is a fine example of Victorian Rural Gothic architecture;
 - the place is believed to be the only surviving church in Western Australia, originally built on private property by the landowner;
 - the place is closely associated with one of the first families to farm the area around the Hay River; and,
 - the place contributes to the Mt. Barker Anglican community's sense of place.
