10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Pinjarra Court House (fmr), a single storey brick and tile Inter-War Georgian Revival building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is rare as a court house built in the 1930s, and as a largely intact example of a court house constructed in the Inter-War Georgian Revival style with Art Deco stylistic detailing;

the place is associated with the administration of justice and the maintenance of law and order in Pinjarra and the Murray district, with the site having been used for court purposes from 1864 to 2003;

the place makes a significant contribution to the historic streetscape of Pinjarra and forms an integral part of a civic precinct in the main street; and,

the place was designed by the Architectural Division of the Public Works Department under the direction of A.E (Paddy) Clare, during a time when the State government resumed public building following the Depression.

The rear addition (1972 and 1977) has little significance.
