10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

St Peter's Church, a small one room timber building in the Federation Carpenter Gothic style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place and its fittings are important for their aesthetic characteristics as a simple, furnished timber building in the Carpenter Gothic style,

the place has a high degree of integrity and authenticity. Much of the original fabric is intact and there are a significant number of the original furnishings all of which were specifically built for the church;

the place is a landmark feature in a natural bushland setting in the Pindellup district;

the place is highly valued by the local community for its historic, social, cultural and religious associations.

The adjoining Pindellup Cemetery is aesthetically and historically important as the burial ground for pioneer settlers in the district and their descendants.
