10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

London Court, comprising a three and four level open air arcade simulating an Elizabethan period shopping street, originally had fifty-three shops, fifty-five offices and twenty-four flats, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a distinctive landmark in the Central City Area of Perth and contributes to the streetscape of both St. George's Terrace and of Hay Street;

the richly detailed facade of the place and it's distinctive clocks are important tourist attractions;

the place is historically associated with the development of the shopping precinct of Hay Street, and the construction of shopping arcades as a medium for north-south pedestrian movement through the city;

the place is closely associated with the entrepreneur and miner, Claude de Bernales;

the place has social value as a place for the people of Perth to shop, and for the association of the place with Britain and British history;

the place is representative of the Inter-War Old English style of architecture, embodying all the principle elements of the style: and,

it is a rare example of an open air city arcade.
