10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Donnybrook Post Office, a single-storey Federation Free Classical style brick, render and corrugated iron roof post office, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is a good example of a Federation Free Classical purpose built post office;
 - the place has been and continues to be an important part of the life of the community; and,
 - it exhibits characteristics that contribute to the aesthetic qualities of the streetscape.

The rear of the site has been cleared of structures and is now either fallow or used for car parking and is not regarded as essential for retaining the cultural

heritage significance of the place. The metal frame shed to the east of the building is intrusive.
