10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

St. Louis Catholic Church, Boyanup, a weatherboard building with a corrugated iron steeply pitched roof, and designed in the Federation Carpenter Gothic style, is of cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a fine, and uncommon example of an intact Federation Carpenter Gothic style rural timber church;

the place is a prominent landmark in Boyanup, situated in a pastoral landscape viewed from both entrances from the both main entrances of the town; and

the place is very important to the Catholic community as it has provided a place of worship for early settlers and it is very highly valued for its continued religious and community use.

The changes to the altar are of little significance, whilst the entry porch and ablutions block are intrusive.
