10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Lieutenant Du Cane's House, a single-storey brick and cement tile house, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place is significant for its association with the administration of public works and convict activity for Guildford in the first years of the colony;
 - the place has historic value for its association with Lieutenant Du Cane, an important figure in the history of Western Australia and later, in the United Kingdom, and
 - the place is a rare example of a residential building with detached stables within the metropolitan area.
