10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Wongan Hills Hospital (fmr), a complex of former hospital buildings consisting of a main brick building in the Inter-war Bungalow style displaying typical Edwardian detailing, and associated brick mortuary and timber framed and fibro utility buildings, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place provides evidence of a rural community's co-operative and on-going commitment to the cause of providing health facilities in the town and demonstrates the process of development of a rural hospital facility;

the place provides an intact example of a rural hospital constructed entirely by public subscription during the Great Depression;

the place is associated with people who were prominent in the development of Wongan Hills, including architect J. H. Ackland; Dr A. Stenning, the town's first doctor; and, Dr T. Lovegrove, the district's longest serving doctor; and,

as a museum, the place facilitates an understanding of ways of life in rural Western Australia, informs the community of its heritage and provides direct links with its past role as a hospital.
