### 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

*Northampton State Battery*, a lead battery complex consisting of crushing mill, offices, workshop, manager's house, weighbridge and a large gravity dam, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is the only gravity separation plant for the treatment of heavy minerals in the Western Australian State Battery complex;

the place is directly related to the third phase of mining activity (1948-1981) in the Murchison mineral fields;

the place is valued by the local community and contributes to its sense of place; and,

the group of structures and machinery are dominant features over the natural environment.
