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10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*King Cottage*, a simple vernacular brick and timber shingle dwelling, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

it is a rare example of a picturesque Georgian Survival rural cottage which is in sound condition;

it has historic value as marking an early main route through the Stirling estate (Location 26); for its consequent fringe association with the Preston River settlement precinct; as evidencing the history of the subdivision of the estate; as evidencing part of the history of brickmaking and bricklaying; and as a fine example of a mid to late nineteenth century artisan's dwelling of the south-west; and,

it has social value as a community undertaking and information source contributing to the community's sense of coherence .

The assessment does not include the museum amenity, display buildings and artefacts, nor any of the moveable collections, etc.
