10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Cooya Pooya Station, consisting of a single-storey stone and iron homestead, detached kitchen and shearer's kitchen, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place has associations with the development of the pastoral industry in the Pilbara district and demonstrates the evolution of a pastoral settlement since 1882;

the place has close associations with W. S. Hall and the Lockyer and Stove families, early pastoralists in the Pilbara who were prominent in the development of the North-West pastoral industry. The place also has associations with the Aboriginal people who worked and lived on the property; and,

the place demonstrates design features responsive to the North-West climate, innovative concrete work and fine stone work, executed in local materials.

Other buildings nearby, including the meat house, poultry shed, stables, shearing shed and shearers' quarters, are considered to have some heritage significance and contribute to the understanding of the place.
