10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**  
*Subiaco Oval Gates*, a single storey limestone and brick construction Inter War Art Deco style ticket office and turnstile building with a Marseilles patterns clay tiled roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
  - the place has been a well-recognised landmark since its construction in 1935 ;
  - the place has historic value marking the location of the WANFL to Subiaco Oval in the year following opening of the gates;

the place contributes to the community's sense of place, as the main entrance to Subiaco Oval, a well known meeting place and enduring image of Subiaco Oval for thousands of football supporters; and,

the place is a small scale well executed Inter War Art Deco style building.

The tubular steel race extensions at the front of the gates, the flanking brick and steel fences and attached signage, together with modern turnstiles have low significance.
