10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Uniting Church, Broome, an Inter-War Bungalow style timber frame fibro clad building with a corrugated iron roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place has considerable aesthetic value;
 - the building is a distinctive part of the streetscape and makes a positive contribution to the character of the town;
 - the place is evidence of the religious and social activities of the Uniting Church in Broome and the Kimberley district and fulfills

an important role in the religious activities of the Broome community; and,

the place exhibits technical sophistication in the operable (moveable) walls and clerestory windows which demonstrate significant response to the tropical climate.
