10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Tranby House has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is the earliest extant residence in the inner metropolitan area;
the place is a landmark on the Swan River foreshore and, through its strong visual connection to the river and picturesque massing, contributes to the aesthetic qualities of the landscape;

the place has a close association with the Hardey family; farming pioneers who were influential in the religious, business and political life of the Swan River colony;

the place has potential to yield information regarding the way of life of colonists in the Swan River Colony; and,

the place is held in high esteem by the general community as an historic place, and focus of cultural tourism.
