1. **NUMBER** 2048
2. **NAME** *Royal Perth Hospital Administration Bldng*
3. **LOCATION** Murray Street, Perth
4. **DESCRIPTION OF ELEMENTS INCLUDED IN THE ENTRY (GENERAL)**

Built in 1896 and designed by George Temple Poole, this four storey red brick and tile building features a dominant elevated first floor entry, stepped stair windows and dormer windows.

6. **OWNER** Board of Management Royal Perth Hospital
7. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE OF PLACE (ASSESSMENT IN DETAIL)**

The place has been assessed by the National Trust of Australia (WA) and has been entered in the Register held by that body as a classified building with the following statement of significance:

This building and the garden fence are handsome examples of their period. The building utilizes the red brick which is the predominant building material within the precinct and it is compatible with the other buildings of both the precinct and the RPH group.

The elevated first floor entry stairs and porch, the entry hall and main staircase, and the stair detail of the western facade are worthy of particular note.

The garden is an important component of the scale and character of the building.

The place has also been assessed by the Australian Heritage Commission and has been entered in the Register of the National Estate with the following statement of significance:

The building and garden fence are handsome examples of their period and complement Kirkman House immediately to the west.
