10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

St. Patrick's Anglican Church (fmr) and War Memorial, Bunbury, the Church is of timber and iron construction displaying characteristics of the Federation Carpenter Gothic style and the War Memorial is of masonry construction, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the Church is aesthetically significant in achieving a pleasing balance between interest and simplicity in form, fabric and construction technique;

the War Memorial (1920) commemorates those from the district who served in the armed forces during World War One, and contributes to local residents' sense of place and community; the place displays precinctual qualities in the association with the *Clifton Residence* opposite;

the Church is highly valued by the local community for religious and social associations and its ongoing role as a Church of Christ; and

the Church has stood since 1908 on its spacious corner site. These historic and aesthetic landmark qualities contribute to the local community's sense of place.
