10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Sailmaker's Shed (fmr), Broome, a single-storey double-volume corrugated
iron shed built c.1907 adjacent to the Mangrove Point shorefront of Roebuck
Bay, has cultural heritage significance for the following reason:

the place is a rare remaining example of an original vernacular building associated with the operation of the pearling industry in Western Australia.

The concrete footing remnants of the PWD offices at the west end (Robinson Street frontage), the steel framed tower and the boat are of no heritage significance.
