# 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Balcatta Senior High School, a predominantly single storey linear plan brick and concrete construction and tiled roof high school complex in an urban residential setting, principally developed between 1966–1972, with numerous additions in matching and contrasting styles, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a good representative example of the secondary schools built in Western Australia during the early post World War Two period following the introduction of the Education Department's 'Co-educational Comprehensive Community High Schools' policy and subsequent changes in response to Education Department policy;

the place is rare as a Post World War Two Mediterranean style public building;

the place was established from 1966 to cater for the wave of children born after World War Two, including many migrant children in the local area, who began reaching high school age from the late 1950s; and,

the place is a fine example of the work of prominent Western Australian architect Marshall Clifton.
